### FROM THE PASTOR'S HEART

We begin the Year of Matthew this month, THE GOSPEI just in time for the Birth Narrative to be told from a Jewish point of view. Matthew's MATTHEW Gospel was once my favorite. I loved how the prophecies from the Old Testament were each fulfilled in Jesus' coming. There was something about how the stories of the Old Testament were linked to the New Testament that appealed to me. People's names, the names for special places - everything has meaning!

Don't we long for loose ends to be tied up neatly in a bow? Don't we want guestions answered? Matthew might appeal to you! Then, there are the mysterious interventions - the peculiar dreams, the angel



visitations, and the messages they bear. Matthew is organized - truly, a Teacher's Gospel! Jesus is the new Moses - the one who redefines the Law of God.

Lutherans emphasize both Law and Gospel. The Law convicts us, by holding a mirror up to our faces and we flee from it. But where can we go? Only to Christ Jesus, who fulfills the law on our behalf, and offers us Grace abundant, undeserved and unreserved.

There is something in me that wants God's People to see themselves more clearly, in order to see the Grace of God more clearly too. For instance, I would love to

see people take more seriously, the Third Commandment – to Honor the Sabbath. We all love to experience the sanctuary filled on Christmas Eve – but why not every Sunday? God is pretty



clear about it: The Sabbath is for rest from our labors and is to be used to Worship God, to Study God's Word, and to return Thanks to God for all our many blessings.

Yet, many folks treat Sunday as the day of rest in order to focus on themselves. By ignoring the Sabbath call to Worship, we disrespect God and miss out on the messages God longs to speak to us. We miss the fellowship with other believers, we exclude ourselves from the work of the community at prayer, and we exchange the Holy Meal for food that does not satisfy. Why?

This week I received a very nice note from folks who visit us a few times a year. They have a timeshare nearby and come to Trinity whenever they stay the weekend. In the note, they mention how very much they enjoy coming to Trinity and how God speaks to them every time they attend. They wish they lived closer, so they could attend more often. Wow, isn't that something? It warms my heart. But it also pains me to know, that many of our folks at Trinity who need to hear God's Word each Sabbath, go hungry instead.

Come, Let us Worship the Lord! Let us enter into the courts of the Lord with Thanksgiving!

### VIEW FROM THE LOFT

#### Bring a Torch Jeannette, Isabella

I was teaching the carol, *Bring a torch, Jeanette, Isabella!* to a student of mine this week and thought I would share the history and story behind this lesser known carol with Trinity as well. The tradition it is based around has always intrigued me. First let's look at the first stanza:

Bring a torch, Jeanette, Isabella! Bring a torch, to the stable call Christ is born. Tell the folk of the village Jesus is born and Mary's calling. Ah! Ah! beautiful is the Mother! Ah! Ah! beautiful is her child!

Firstly, contrary to popular belief it is Jeannette *and* Isabella, two different girls... not one girl named Jeannette Isabella. The tune to the hymn, Un Flambeau, originates from a 14<sup>th</sup> century dance. It likely became paired with its current lyrics around 1550 as it first appeared in a compilation of Christmas music, *Cantiques de Premiere Advenement de Jesus-Christ*, published in 1553 by a wealthy French count

whose hobby was the collection of Christmas music. Most musicologists believe the hymn inspired a famous painting, The Newborn Christ (c. 1648), painting by Georges de La Tour, which depicts two young women holding baby Jesus.




According to the French legend which inspired the hymn, Jeannette and Isabella are the daughters of the innkeeper who put Mary and Joseph in his stable for the night. The legend likely developed in the Province region of France where to this day it is a tradition that before Christmas Eve Mass the daughters of the village go door to door with candles or in some cases even Advent wreaths on their heads, and spread the news that Jesus has been born. Many of the women even dress up like milkmaids or shepherdesses. In some cases, gifts are even exchanged as the news is spread...kind of like reverse trick-or-treat. This goes along with stanza two of the hymn:

> Who is that, knocking on the door? Who is it, knocking like that? Open up, we've arranged on a platter Lovely cakes that we have brought here Knock! Knock! Knock! Open the door for us! Knock! Knock! Knock! Let's celebrate!

Though the carol, "*Bring a torch, Jeanette, Isabella*!" is not in our Lutheran hymnal, we do have a Christmas hymn that uses the tune "Un Flambeau." Our hymn, ELW #292, is called, "Love Has Come" and is more thematically relevant for us but still gives a "nod" to this classic carol.

Dear Friends,

God's grace and peace be with you. We are moving into the Reformation year as October 31, 2017 will mark the 500<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the beginning of the Reformation. 500 years after Luther posted his 95 Theses in Wittenberg, Germany we are still seeing the Holy Spirit move and reform us and our church. God is active and moving here in our Allegheny Synod.

Our Synod Office has been focused this past year on working to better tell the story of what we do together as the people of God. Through the Lutheran Letter, our Allegheny Synod Facebook page, the Allegheny Synod weekly e-news, and the letters, emails, and other communications we send, we are telling the story of what God is doing through you in this Synod. If you want to be connected to these communications, call our Synod Office for more information.

There are wonderful things going on in the Allegheny Synod. We have congregations growing food for local food banks, thousands of quilts being put together to be sent to people in need, and our congregations reach out to help when there are needs in the community. As God's people, you faithfully minister and care for each other in times of joy and in sorrow. There is life and hope in our congregations because Jesus Christ and the power of the Holy Spirit is with us and reminds us that there is always work to be done. We gather with fellow Christians to pray together, to build bridges of friendship, and celebrate the unity we have in Jesus Christ.






