TODAY'S HYMNS

ELW 883 All People That on Earth Do Dwell (OLD HUNDREDTH).

This hymn originated in the 14th century and has appeared in hymnals used by Trinity Church since 1917. It has been set to a variety of texts (ex. "Before Jehovah's Awesome Throne" and "Praise God, from Whom all Blessings Flow.")

ELW 584 The Son of God, Our Christ (SURSUM CORDA). This is a 20th century hymn included in the LBW (green hymnal) and ELW. It is sung to the same notes as "Joy to the World."

ELW 661 I Love to Tell the Story (HANKEY). This beloved hymn was new to the Lutheran Church when it appeared in our red Service Book and Hymnal, c. 1958.



WORD

First Reading: Exodus 19:2-8a



Holy Gospel: Matthew 9:35—10:8 [16-23]

The Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew. Glory to you, O Lord.

Jesus went about all the cities and villages (on the west side of the Sea of Galilee), teaching in their synagogues, and proclaiming the good news of the kingdom, and curing every disease and every sickness. When he saw the crowds, he had compassion for them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. Then he said to his disciples, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; therefore ask the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest."

Then Jesus summoned his twelve disciples and gave them authority over unclean spirits, to cast them out, and to cure every disease and every sickness. These are the names of the twelve apostles: first, Simon, also known as Peter, and his brother Andrew; James son of Zebedee, and his brother John; Philip and Bartholomew; Thomas and Matthew the tax collector; James son of Alphaeus, and Thaddaeus; Simon the Cananaean, and Judas Iscariot, the one who betrayed him.

These twelve Jesus sent out with the following instructions: "Go nowhere among the Gentiles, and enter no town of the Samaritans, but go rather to the lost sheep of the house of Israel. As you go, proclaim the good news, 'The kingdom of heaven has come near.' Cure the sick, raise the dead, cleanse the lepers, cast out demons. You received without payment; give without payment.

["See, I am sending you out like sheep into the midst of wolves; so be wise as serpents and innocent as doves. Beware of them, for they will hand you over to councils and flog you in their synagogues; and you will be dragged before governors and kings because of me, as a testimony to them and the Gentiles. When they hand you over, do not worry about how you are to speak or what you are to say; for what you are to say will be given to you at that time; for it is not you who speak, but the Spirit of your Father speaking through you. Brother will betray brother to death, and a father his child, and children will rise against parents and have them put to death; and you will be hated by all because of my name. But the one who endures to the end will be saved. When they persecute you in one town, flee to the next; for truly I tell you, you will not have gone through all the towns of Israel before the Son of Man comes."]





