Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

The gospel reading last Sunday was from the sixth chapter of Mark's gospel. We heard about the rejection of Jesus at Nazareth, his sending out of his disciples to proclaim repentance, cast out demons, and anoint with oil many who were sick and cure them. More tragically, we heard about the death of John the Baptist while imprisoned by King Herod Antipas, son of Herod the Great.

John the Baptist was an enigma to Herod Antipas. On the one hand, Herod was intrigued by John. He enjoyed their conversations and liked to listen to him. He was also well aware of John's popularity and his reputation as a righteous and holy man, so he sought to protect him.

On the other hand, John the Baptist had repeatedly warned Herod against marrying his brother Philip's wife *(Herodias),* which greatly angered her. Out of spite, Herodias pressured Herod to kill him.

In the end, Herod found himself backed into a corner with no way out. He succumbed to his wife's pressure, ordered John's beheading, and had his head delivered to his wife on a platter.

On the second Sunday of Advent, 2023, we heard a dramatic monolog in worship presented by John the Baptizer *(played by John Centi)*. We asked, "Well, this is entertaining, but what does it have to do with us?" He responded with a 2-point answer:

First: Prepare the way of the LORD!

Repent! Change the direction of your life that isn't in sync with the path to Christ. For some of you, it may be a small redirection onto the right path. Or, it may call you to radically change the entire direction of your life. In any case, put all of yourself in God's hands!

And then there's this: Begin a way of living that reflects the LORD's love for all people. Love one another!

Be concerned about those around you. Take the skills and resources that you have and make straight the path for others to reach the Kingdom, by pointing the way – just as I did – to Jesus.

It seemed so easy to take seriously John's admonition to change the direction of our lives that aren't in sync with Jesus and to be God's love to the world. Perhaps this was because there was nothing in the message about dying!

But now we're approaching the season of Lent, confronted with Mark's gospel detailing John's death, and reminded that just as John was willing to serve God, so we too, are to present ourselves as living sacrifices to God.

Dear siblings in Christ, are we *really* ready to speak truth to power, and to defend justice and righteousness *regardless of the cost*? Are we *really* willing to ask God to make us *Just like John*? That's a tough ask.

TEN OTHER THINGS YOU MIGHT GIVE UP FOR LENT

A recent <u>online, non-scientific survey</u> by *Christianity Today* revealed the most popular things people give up for Lent: 1) social networking, 2) chocolate, 3) Twitter, 4) alcohol, and 5) chips. I for one am giving up the use of electronic devices at the dinner table, much to the delight of my two daughters. Madelyn is giving up playing games on her smartphone, and Grace is giving up afternoon snacks. I had to convince them that giving up homework was not an appropriate Lenten discipline.

As I've thought about it, there are some deeper parts of your life that you might consider giving up for Lent, for the sake of your own spiritual maturity and personal development. In no particular order, and by no means exhaustive, here are some things I thought of that you might want to consider as part of your Lenten journey this year:

Give up the need to be right all the time.

Business author Patrick Lencioni said, "People don't need to feel like they are right, as much as they need to feel like they've been heard." Yes, claim your voice, assert your convictions, and engage the issues that matter to you. But once you've been heard, consider the possibility that you might have something to learn from someone who disagrees with you. That's often how we learn our most important lessons in life. (James 1:19)

Give up your reluctance to ask for help.

It is true that giving up something for Lent requires discipline, will, and self-mastery. But it also requires the recognition that we cannot always be self-sufficient. You are not superhuman. You do not have inexhaustible reserves. Turn to loved ones for support, seek the wise counsel of others, and don't be afraid to ask for help. (Psalm 69)

Give up your fear of failure.

Mother Theresa said, "God does not call us to be successful; God calls us to be faithful." You may sometimes gauge your self-worth by what you have achieved and how you have succeeded. You might subconsciously depend on the affirmation of others to feel good about yourself. But your worth does not equal your work, nor are you defined by your failures. Some people live a whole lifetime before they come to realize that. Save yourself the heartache later. Learn it now. (Proverbs 3:5-6)

Give up comparing yourself to others.

Forget the Joneses. They are not worth keeping up with. Find contentment in what you have, and who God has created you to be. You do not need the envious admiration of others. You need not be defined by what you do not have. While there is nothing wrong with being self-motivated and goal-oriented, don't evaluate your life in comparison to others. It's not worth it. (James 4:2-3)

Give up the need to have things all figured out.

Embrace mystery. Dance with your doubts. Acknowledge that you do not and cannot know it all. Resist the temptation to rationalize the irrational parts of your faith, and recognize that some of the greatest things in life are those things that cannot be explained or fully understood. Things like God's love for you, and how God is with you even when you don't believe it. (Romans 11:33-36)

Give up your fears of the future.

I get it. These are frightening times for many people. There is great nervousness about the way things are in the world. And I would guess that you are dealing with fears yourself. I have learned over my twenty years of parish ministry that everyone — without exception — has something that they are dealing with. We all have our fears, but we don't need to be defined by them. For God is a God of hope. (Matthew 6:33-34)

Give up anesthetizing yourself to pain and suffering.

The long shadow of suffering is cast in many shades, like loneliness, grief, abandonment, and betrayal. None of us enjoys going through difficulties, and our instinct is often to numb ourselves from the pain in ways that are actually self-destructive: giving in to addictions, accumulating possessions, pursuing temporal pleasures, and cocooning ourselves from the rest of the world. These might anesthetize us in the short term, but they prevent us from allowing that pain to help us stretch, grow, and trust in God. (Romans 5:3-5)

Give up the need to be in control.

This one is at the heart of the season of Lent. It is a reminder that we ultimately are not in control of what happens to us. We cannot control others, and we can hardly claim to have full control of ourselves and our future. Let the Covenant Prayer of Wesley be your guide, to remind you that you are not your own; you belong to God. For we must ultimately surrender our control over to a God who has created us and claimed us from the beginning. (Matthew 16:24-25)

Give up the need to make everyone happy.

It's not like you can, anyway. You may have a knack for understanding what others want from you, but you must also claim your own convictions and understand your limitations. Your job is not to be all things to all people and please everyone you know. God calls you to live a life of integrity, uncompromising in your commitment to Jesus Christ. For God, after all, is the only one you need to please. (Galatians 1:10)

Give up all the non-essential noise in your life.

This may be the toughest thing of all to give up, but it may be the key to a deeply moving Lenten season for you. Your life is inundated by competing voices and blaring noises from the culture around you. Pay attention to your breath. Take walks. Drive without the radio on. Set the cell phone down when you're at the family table. Watch less television, read more newspapers and books, and look people in the eye when you talk to them. Most of all, pray to God, "Silence all voices but your own." Turn down the volume of your life and connect to a God who knows you better than you know yourself. (Psalm 46:10)

A VIEW FROM THE LOFT

God's Wonderful World: Bird Buddy

"I know all the birds of the air, and all that moves in the field is mine." (Psalm 50:11)

For Christmas this year my wife gifted me a Bird Buddy bird feeder. It has a built-in motion activated Wi-Fi camera that connects to a smartphone and takes both photos and videos of birds as they eat from the feeder and sends them to the smartphone. I have always loved watching birds, and this has proven a perfect gift for me. One thing I especially love is that it has audio as well as video so that I can hear the birds as they tweet, sing, and chomp through the birdseeds.

The Bird Buddy app provides some biological details about each bird species and even tells you a bit about their songs. I love learning about the different songs each type of bird sings and the different situations they choose to sing different songs for. It turns out that like humans, birds choose different songs based on their mood and based on the situation they are in. In the videos my Bird Buddy has captured thus far, I've seen mated pairs of cardinals take turns at the feeder, tweeting and singing at each other as they eat. I've seen blue jay and tufted titmouse select seeds to take to their nests to hoard for later. I've seen little house finches share the bird feeder platform with each other so that several can eat at the same time. I've seen red-bellied woodpeckers squeeze onto the feeder and carefully select a nut of choice. I've seen song sparrows sing and tweet as they munch. Over the winter storms we recently had, my favorite bird to watch has become the Dark-eyed Junco, a kind of bird I had never even heard of before, but who have apparently been my longtime neighbors, living in my trees and eating my birdseed for some time.

The Bird Buddy app has this to say about Dark-Eyed Junco, "The cold doesn't bother me, in fact, I love it! Did you know that dark-eyed juncos grow their own jackets to protect them from the snow? In winter, their coat can be up to 30%

heavier! Sounds like an awesome superpower to have in winter, right? They are here for a good time and a long time and can live to be 11 years old. For reference, the average lifespan of a bird that survives being a fledging is about three years."

During our weeks of blizzards and extreme wind chill, I was so blessed to watch these amazing creatures happily eat birdseed and tweet in front of my camera. Birds have a special place in the Bible and in my heart. They are nature's musicians and always



described as special to God throughout the Bible, and yet we are told by Christ that we are more precious than many birds!

The more I study and learn of biological science the surer I am that nature and science are powerful witnesses to God's wonderful creation and certainly studying them is not a threat to scripture. I think science brings us closer to God, rather than being in opposition to God. For many years and even to this day, some Christians have felt threatened by science and that exploring it further can be a detriment to faith, but I couldn't disagree more. Did you know Cardinals sing 28 different types of songs? Maybe a few of them are hymns of praise?

One of the things I appreciate so deeply about ELCA Lutheran worship is that we almost always pray for the environment, nature, and the beautiful creatures, like birds, that God has blessed the earth with. Let's keep appreciating them!







When you go forward during worship to receive the cross of ash on your forehead, the cross that you received when you were baptized is being retraced. We can't see that first cross on a daily basis, but today, with the help of ashes, we can see that cross. We can see the place where the pastor traced a cross and said, "You have been sealed with the promised Holy Spirit and marked with the cross of Christ forever."

And forever, means forever. There is nothing that can separate you from the love of God in Christ Jesus. This ashen cross, though it is a reminder of our earthly mortality, also is a reminder of our eternal freedom in Christ.
