From the **PASTOR**—

JESUS' LIFE IS ON DISPLAY IN US

On the night before his crucifixion, Jesus shared a prayerful conversation with his Father (John 17):

I spelled out your character in detail to the men and women you gave me.

They know now, beyond the shadow of a doubt, that everything you gave me is firsthand from you, for the message you gave me, I gave them.

I pray for them.

Everything mine is yours, and yours mine, and my life is on display in them.

For I'm no longer going to be visible in the world; they'll continue in the world while I return to you.

Holy Father, guard them as they pursue this life that you conferred as a gift through me, so they can be one heart and mind as we are one heart and mind.

"My life is on display in them," Jesus says of the men and women who would follow him. "Holy Father, guard them as they pursue this life so they can be one heart and mind, as we are one heart and mind."

Scripture tells us that we have been formed in the image of God and adopted into the family of the living God. While we celebrate being one in Christ, often we forget that our lives display Jesus' life and expectation that we will be of one heart and mind.

Part of our problem is that we forget to look into the eyes of another and see the eyes of Jesus, our brother and deliverer, as well as the reflection of our own eyes. We all share the same mitochondrial DNA and the same four proteins that make up all living things, including plants and animals.

We are all intimately connected to one another biologically, but

even more than that, we are all connected to one another because we all—every one of us—are God's children.

Jesus has given us a new command to love one another. There are no conditions attached to this command, for example, love one another as long as they look like, act like, and agree with us. Moreover, the love that Jesus commands is not just some warm, fuzzy feeling we have toward others; it is truly accepting the other, even those we don't like, as our kin. We, as the Synagogue, Church, Mosque, and individuals, believers and many unbelievers, are to model something unique—a family unity even with our worst enemies.

To be sure, this is extremely difficult since we have all, to a greater or lesser degree, have grown up with the adage: Don't get mad; get even. Beyond that, one of our basic human responses is anger. But anger isn't really a bad emotion; the difficulty is what we do with our anger. We can certainly get angry with one another, but we don't need to destroy another's body, mind, or spirit as we passionately express our anger.

I am more and more convinced that when it comes to modeling peace, we wait for others, and especially governments, to exhibit it in our stead. The trouble is, just like trickle-down economics doesn't work, neither does trickle-down peacemaking. The great peacemakers and compassionate lovers of humanity in our world—Jesus, Mohammad, St. Francis of Assisi, Gandhi, Martin Luther King Jr., Mother Theresa—all knew and lived the passionate peace and love with which God had empowered them. As many politicians suggest—it is frightening to me that I agree—'everything is local'. We must begin with those closest to us, those whom we can influence by our lives of peacemaking. With this suggestion I don't just mean we as individuals, but especially we as a congregation.

Jesus' life is on display in us!

As we grow in the faith, our ministries will be a sign of the God who brings peace into the world. It is the little things that we

are doing and will continue to do that show our community and our neighborhoods what loving one another and peacemaking are—little things like quilts for those in need, food collected for the Food Pantry, and prayers for those suffering whom we do not even know. As individuals and members of a faith community, we are Jesus' life on display in our homes, neighborhoods, community, and world.

May God continue to grant us the courage and strength to faithfully display the life and will of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ in all we say, do, and are!

VIEW FROM THE LOFT

Sacred Music is, well... Sacred.

I began piano lessons at the age of 6, but I didn't really like it. It took me until I was a teenager to love playing instruments. One of the things that made me come around was sitting in church year after year singing along to hymns, listening to the organ and piano, and hearing the liturgy. Eventually through experience, I realized that music is powerful and something everyone can do. Music wasn't just a performance for rock stars or praise bands with flashing stage lights. I also learned that music is most fun when everyone is sharing it. It is such a gift to children to be able to attend worship that not only teaches them about the love of God, but also that allows them to experience sacred music. When well done, sacred music not only teaches great theology, but also teaches musical skills.

I recently published a book titled, *Psalms* from a Song Perspective <insert shameless plug noting that it is available on Amazon>. In the book, I explore how being aware that the book of Psalms is made up of musical pieces and not just poems can change the way we read and understand them. From my experience people are often surprised to even be told that psalms were musical pieces, let alone to



read them that way. When we read a psalm each Sunday in worship, I invite you to remind yourself of this.

In modern times we are blessed with generations and generations of hymnody, something our Lutheran heritage is particularly gifted in. A great deal of thought and effort is put into selecting music and liturgy that make our worship more fulfilling. Yet, many still think of music as "a nice extra." The fact that the Bible contains an entire book of Psalms (as well

as many other songs and references to them) and our Lutheran tradition, both beckon us to see music as more than "extra."

Did you ever notice that Jesus sings? Matthew 26:30 tells us that Jesus and his disciples sang a hymn before the central events of Good Friday and Easter. Hebrews 2:12 instructs us that Jesus sings hymns of joy and praise when acknowledging we humans as his brothers and sisters. Romans 15:9 reminds us that songs of praise are the proper response to Christ's acceptance of all people. Many people will recall that Jesus "cries out" from the cross quoting from Psalm 22...perhaps he was singing in anguish and not just quoting? Makes you wonder what Jesus's singing voice was like doesn't it? I don't think it was trained or perfect. I think much like his appearance (Isaiah 53:2) Jesus would have had a regular voice, showing us once more that he is one of us.

I think all music is a gift from God, not just that which specifically is meant for worship or praise, but sacred music is especially powerful to us. I am continually thankful to be blessed with a congregation that sings together, has many who are willing to play handbells, and many who are willing to sing in a choir. We are already blessed by sacred music, just like we are already recipients of God's grace. Many times, all that is lacking is our awareness. Open your ears to the birds, the winds in the trees, the barking of dogs, the scratching of little tortoise claws, etc. There are sacred sounds everywhere. Music in worship is yet one more reason to join a beloved community rather than worshiping alone.



SECURITY AT TRINITY

In the words of Bob Dylan, "The times they are a-changin'." From unwelcome visitors and active shooters to property crimes, there are numerous threats that can disrupt the peace and sanctity of houses of worship. Using a church security system is key to an ongoing, comprehensive security plan and is essential in addressing safety concerns and maintaining a safe environment for all.



After much study over the course of 9+ years, the new security system in the Educational Building has been fully installed and will be **in full operation on Monday, May 13.** Special thanks to Pete Jacobson, Jody Jurgevich (System Administrator), and Ann Voytish for your hands-on labor.

Our intention is not to prevent church members and/or Child Care staff and parents from entering the Educational Building. Many folks have legitimate reasons to be in the building, for example: Child Care parents, Trinity members, Committee members, Church Council, Food Pantry volunteers, those attending Sunday afternoon worship in the Chapel, Sunday School staff and students, and church employees. The goal is to eliminate the use of outside keys for the Educational Building and keep everyone safe.

People who frequently need access to Trinity's Educational Building will receive or already have received a 4-digit pin code to access the building via the **center doors**.

- 1. Type in your code on the keypad next to the door.
- 2. Listen for the beep.
- 3. Watch the red line on the keypad turn green.
- 4. Pull the left door handle to open the door.
 It is not necessary to depress the lock on door handle.
- 5. When you enter the building, the door will automatically close and lock behind you.

Throughout the week, the "Child Care" door nearest the Chapel will be permanently locked. The "Playground" door will also be permanently locked except on Wednesday mornings when Food Pantry clients are picking up food.

On Sundays, the "Middle or Center" door and "Child Care/ Chapel" door will be unlocked from 8:15 to 10:15 a.m. for Sunday School, confirmation students, parents, and teachers. The "Child Care/Chapel" door will be unlocked 4:15 to 6:15 p.m. on Sundays to accommodate folks attending Worship at 5:00 p.m. and the 5:45 p.m. healing service.

To register and activate your 4-digit security pin code, please contact Ann in the church office if you haven't done so yet. Together, the staff will be troubleshooting any issues when the security system is first activated on Monday, May 13.

ANY MEMBERS OR GROUPS wanting to use Trinity's facilities or Pavilion should call the church office (445-5446) to schedule the date and time for the year, even if you have used it for the same date/event in the past. Often we have multiple requests for the same date, especially the Pavilion.





STEPHEN MINISTRY



What Is Stephen Ministry?

Bear one another's burdens, and in this way you will fulfill the law of Christ (Galatians 6:2, NRSV).

Stephen Ministry offers a proven and effective way to organize, equip, and supervise a team of congregation members—called *Stephen Ministers*

—to provide high-quality, one-to-one, Christ-centered care to people in the congregation and the community experiencing life difficulties.

Who's Involved in Stephen Ministry?

STEPHEN LEADERS are pastors and lay leaders trained to provide ongoing leadership for their congregation's Stephen Ministry. They are equipped for this key role through the Bridge Leader's Training Course offered by Stephen Ministries St. Louis.

STEPHEN MINISTERS are congregation members trained by their Stephen Leaders to offer care to people who are hurting. A Stephen Minister typically has one care receiver at a time and meets with that person once a week for about an hour.

CARE RECEIVERS are individuals in the congregation or community who are going through a crisis or life difficulty. Potential care receivers first meet with a pastor or Stephen Leader, who assesses their needs for care and matches them with a Stephen Minister. The caring relationship lasts for as long as the need persists.

What are the Blessings of Stephen Ministry?

Stephen Ministry multiplies blessings throughout the church and community.

Congregations carry out Christ's commandment to "Love one another as I have loved you" (John 15:12 RSV) in a powerful and practical way.

Pastors have a team of gifted, trained, and committed lay caregivers ready to minister to hurting people.

Laypeople nurture and use their gifts in meaningful ministry, growing spiritually as they serve others.

People who are hurting have a caring Christian presence to provide emotional and spiritual support.

In short, Stephen Ministry helps carry out the mission of the church.

Stephen Ministry Is Coming to Trinity!

At their April 2022 meeting, the Church Council of Trinity Lutheran Church voted unanimously to grant permission as well as provide start-up funds for initiating the Stephen Ministry Program as part of our ongoing ministry.

The program will be coordinated by a 3-person leadership team including Pastor Ruth and two laypersons. The first step is for the coordinating team to complete training which will be provided by Stephen Ministry.

Once this happens, the leadership team will recruit and train Stephen Ministers – laypeople from our church who will provide one-to-one care (averaging one hour per week). Our Stephen Ministers will be carefully selected, well equipped, supported, and supervised within our congregation to provide that ongoing care. They will be trained in essential caregiving topics like:

- Active listening
- Confidentiality
- Crisis theory and practice
- Maintaining Boundaries
- Ministering during specific types of crises
- and more

Then, our Stephen Ministry leadership team will match our Stephen Ministers with people who need care in our church and the wider community.

Does this mean that Pastor Ruth will no longer provide pastoral care and counseling for those in need? *Absolutely not!* Pastor will always be available and willing to meet with any person(s) in need of pastoral care. This *does* mean that through caring conversations and an ongoing commitment to meet together, Stephen Ministers can provide additional emotional and spiritual support for as long as the need for care exists.

Please pray for this new and vital ministry venture and its leaders.
